### **NEW YEAR-ROUND HOME**

We did it! The Augusta Heritage Center has purchased a historic mixeduse building in the center of downtown Elkins. The first floor will be redeveloped into a dance hall, cafe, and retail space. The second floor will consist of classrooms for future programming and the AHC team headquarters. The top two floors will provide 12 high-quality apartments to artists and AmeriCorps members, each with a community service project as a part of their residency.

In addition to all of the opportunities that this building affords us, we are excited about new and continued partnerships with venues in Elkins and the entire state of West Virginia. The future is bright for Augusta, and we will continue to explore new and exciting ways to propagate and elevate the traditional arts and culture of Appalachia and beyond.


